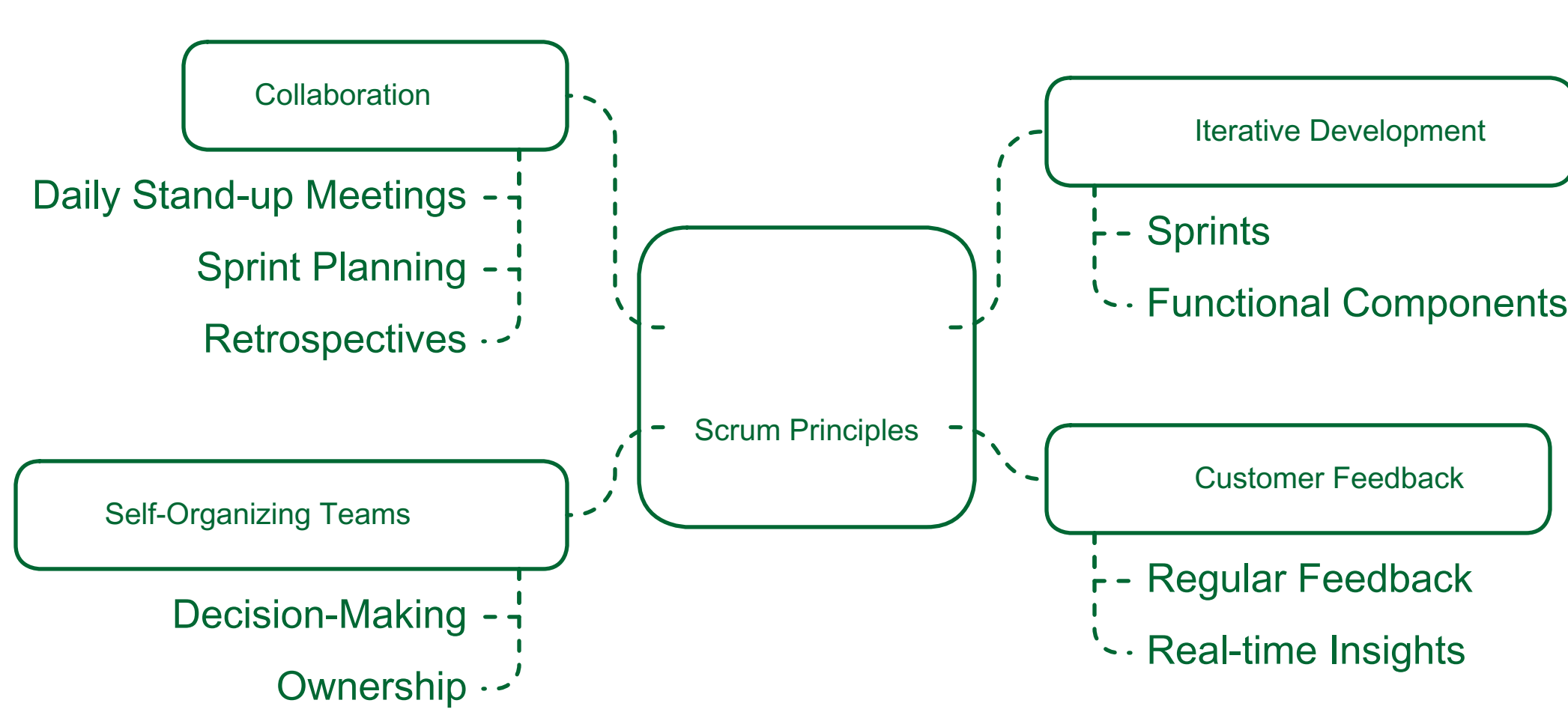
### Scrum's Agile Framework

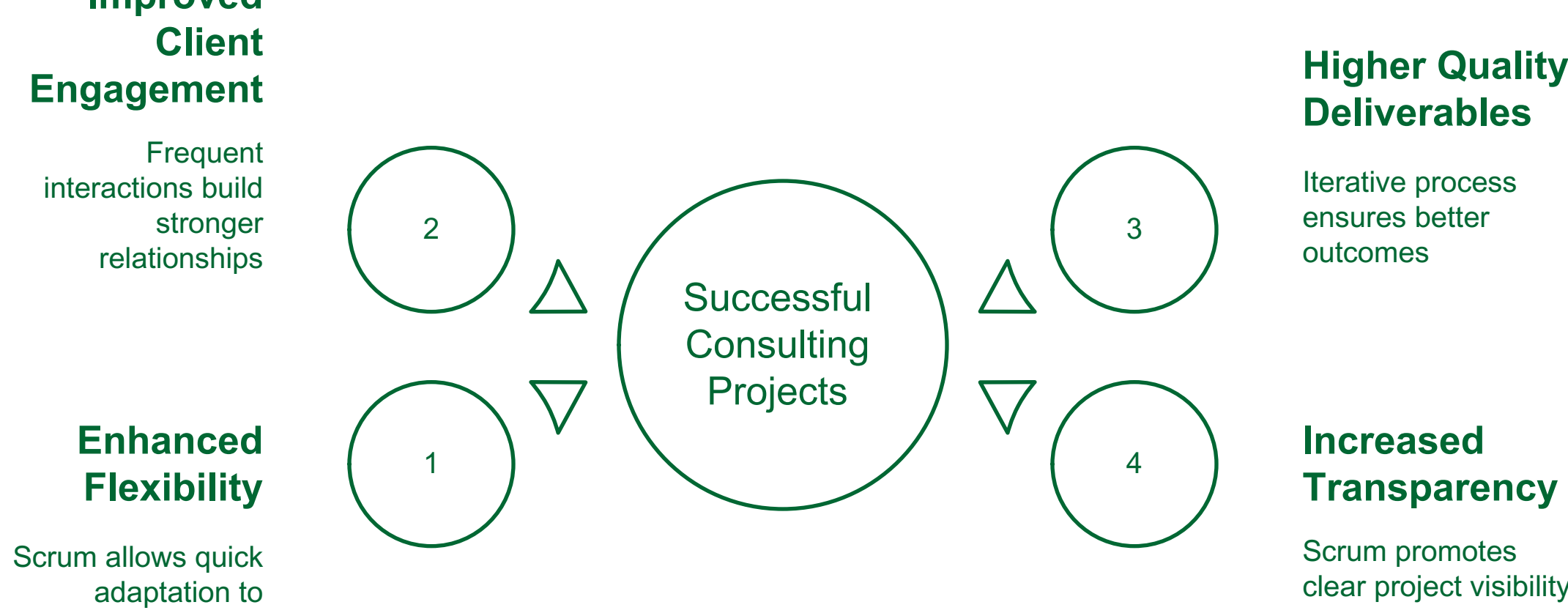

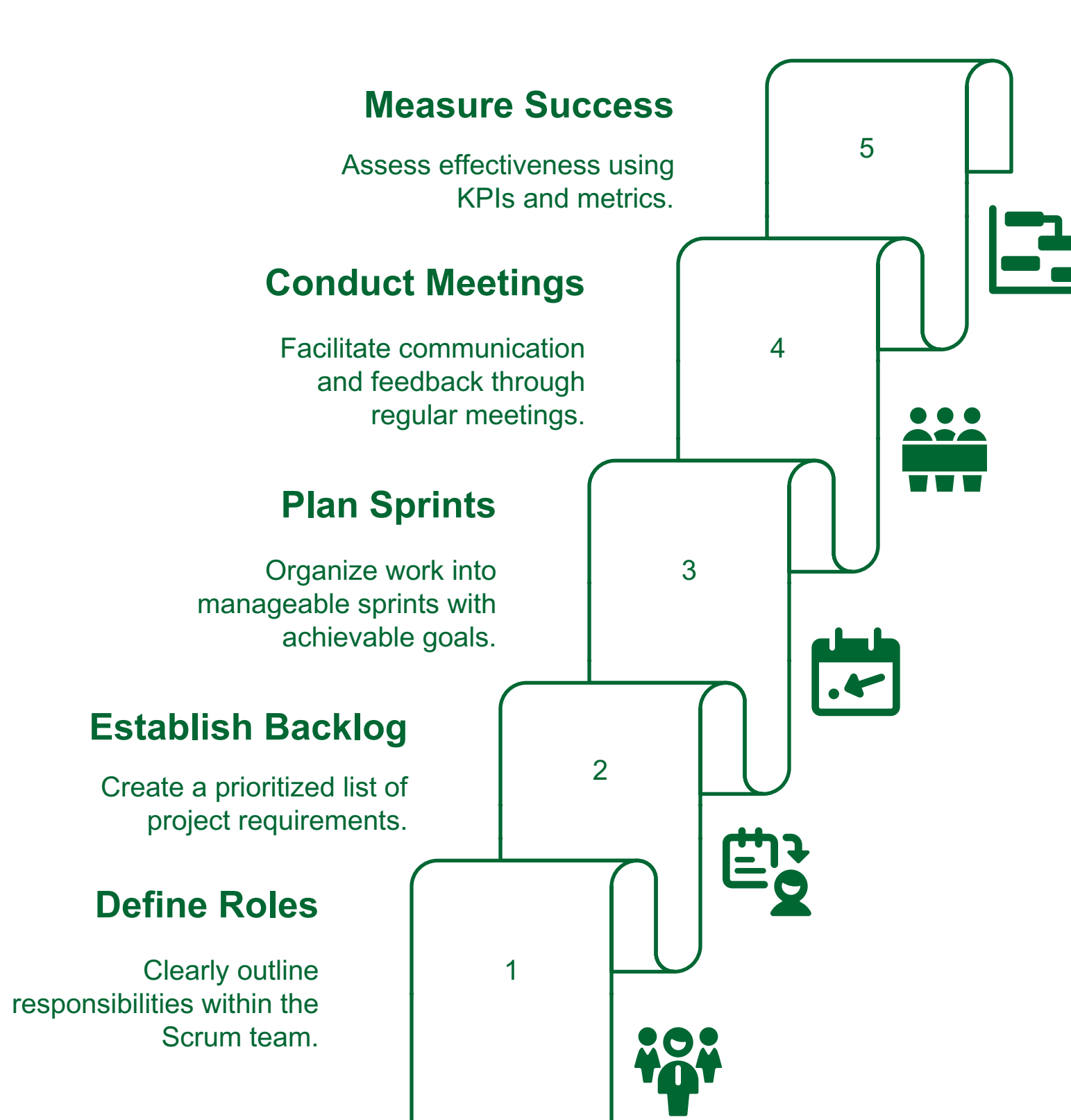
